



Day 1: Fly overnight to Spain

Meet your group and travel overnight to Madrid.

Day 2: Madrid

Arrive in Madrid: Witness the vibrant cultures of Spain and the region of Andalusia as you explore centuries of history.

Walking tour of Madrid: Take an in-depth look at Spain's capital and largest city on a walking tour. Then visit the Prado museum, where you can behold Velázquez's *Las Meninas* and Goya's paired canvases.

Dinner in Madrid: Enjoy your first group dinner in Madrid with traditional Spanish cuisine at a local restaurant.

Day 3: Madrid

Sightseeing in Madrid: See Madrid's past and present as you stroll through Puerta del Sol, one of the city's busiest squares. Then explore Plaza Mayor, the center of old Madrid where you'll learn about the grand square's history of bullfights, royal weddings, and public executions. Get a glimpse of royal Madrid at the extravagant Palacio Real, where you'll wander the fabulous palace interior.

Day 4: Madrid | Granada

Arrive in Granada: Take a morning train ride from Madrid to Granada, Spain. There you'll explore the Andalusia region and see Don Quixote's windmills.

Sightseeing in the Albayzín Quarter: During the afternoon, enter Albayzín, a former Moorish district of Granada and current UNESCO World Heritage Site, with an expert local guide.

Dinner: This evening, enjoy dinner with your group in Granada.

Day 5: Granada

Sightseeing in Granada: Get a good look at Granada as your local guide takes you through the city. Visit the Alhambra, Granada's crowning jewel and widely recognized as the world's premier example of Moorish architecture. Built as an all-in-one *alcazaba* (fortress), *alcazar* (palace) and small medina (city), the Alhambra was home to the last of the Nasrid Sultans.

Free time in Granada: Take the rest of the day to explore on your own. If you're lucky, you might find your own evening of flamenco dancing.

Day 6: Granada | Gibraltar | Tarifa | Tangier

Arrive in Gibraltar: Travel from Granada to Gibraltar, a British territory on the Iberian Peninsula on the southern coast of Spain.

Sightseeing in Gibraltar: Go on a sightseeing tour of the region and see the Moorish Castle, a fortress built in 711 A.D with your expert local guide. Before you depart on an evening ferry to Tangier, visit one of the world's most famous sites, the Rock of Gibraltar, which was once considered the limit to the known world.

Dinner in Tangier: Enjoy a traditional Moroccan dinner in Tangier, your first Moroccan city.

Day 7: Tangier

Sightseeing in Tangier: Start the day early with a sightseeing tour of Tangier, one of Morocco's main ports to Spain and the "Door of Africa." Explore the Medina, a labyrinth of alleyways that attracts visitors from around the world, see the Grand Socco, Hercul Caves and Spatel Cape.

Dinner in Tangier: Try Moroccan delicacies with your group at a local restaurant.

Day 8: Tangier | Chefchaouen | Fez

Arrive in Fez: Travel via Chefchaouen to Fez, the second largest city in Morocco after Casablanca.

Dinner in Fez: Enjoy local cuisine during a group dinner.

Day 9: Fez

Sightseeing in Fez: Fez has been called the "Mecca of the West" and "Athens of Africa"—and its nicknames are no mistake. Take in the northern city on a sightseeing tour that spans the Royal Palace, Mellah Jewish quarter, and Bab Bou Jeloud.

Walking tour of Old Medina: See Morocco's former capital up close as you explore Fez's Old Medina by foot.

Dinner in Fez: Reflect on your day over a group dinner of Moroccan cuisine.

Day 10: Fez | Meknes | Rabat | Casablanca

Arrive in Meknes: Travel an hour from Fez to Meknes, a city known for its imperial past. See all the city has to offer on your group's sightseeing tour, which includes Bab El-Mansour and the Royal Stables.

Arrive in Rabat: Continue your journey through Morocco as you arrive in Rabat, the capital of the country and home to some of Morocco's most important historical events. Before traveling on, your group will experience the Royal Palace Mechouar, the official residence of the king of Morocco.

Arrive in Casablanca: Make the final leg of your tour to Casablanca, perhaps Morocco's most well-known city in the U.S.—thanks to Humphrey Bogart and Ingrid Bergman.

Farewell dinner in Casablanca: Enjoy a final dinner of traditional Moroccan foods with your group.

Day 11: Depart for home

Arrive at the airport, where you'll check in for your return flight home.
